What is this research about?

This research is about how the personal mobility of people with disability is impacted by buses and trains in the public transport system in Southeast Queensland. It will uncover the challenges and barriers that people with disability experience when using public transport in order to develop recommendations for policymakers and transportation providers.

Who can participate?

People who have a disability, live in Southeast Queensland, are 18 years old or older, speak English, have experienced challenges when accessing trains or buses in the public transport system, and have access to a phone, computer, or other electronic devices that can download Microsoft Teams. What do I need to do?

Complete a voluntary 30-45 minute interview on Microsoft Teams or by phone about your experiences in accessing trains and buses in Southeast Queensland. This time and date will be agreed upon together by you and a member of the research team.

Do I have to participate?









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No. This research is voluntary and you do not have to participate. You can also pause or end your interview at any time and stop participating in the research without any penalty.

What is the benefit?

Participants will be offered a \$50 Coles/Myer gift voucher for their time. This research may also benefit Queenslanders with disability by providing a platform for better understanding the way in which personal mobility via public transport systems may be impacted by lack of accessibility, inclusion and undignified experiences.

Who can I contact for further information?

You might want to discuss if this research is right for you, if your accessibility need or mental and emotional needs may be met during this research. You might be unsure if you are eligible to participate or unsure about how the research process works. How can I receive information about the research results?

Participants will receive plain language summaries of each phase of the research results, at the end of that phase. If you would like to discuss this further with the research team, you can do so via email.

How can I trust this research is safe for me?

This research is being conducted by experienced research staff. The research team will work with you to make the process as comfortable as possible.

If you are concerned about your physical, emotional or mental safety during your participation, please talk to the research team about any supports you may need in order to participate (for example, closed captions, a support person present). We encourage you to discuss participation with members of your support network.

All interviews will be audio recorded and transcribed into text. However, your confidentiality and privacy will be safeguarded at all times. Your personal information will be kept confidential and will be removed from all data. Only the research team will have access to your data. Any reportable data will be done in a summary format and if necessary, will include a pseudonym.
